Graduate Fellowship for Minorities

Application deadline: April 15, 2008

The Acoustical Society of America announces the availability of a fellowship for graduate study in scientific areas related to the field of acoustics.

Eligibility: To be eligible for the fellowship, the applicant must have permanent residence or citizenship in the United States or Canada at the time of application. He/she must also be a member of a minority group (Hispanic, African American or Native American) that is underrepresented in the sciences. Evidence of acceptance into, or good academic standing in, a graduate degree program is also required.

Award: The award consists of a \$20,000 stipend for one academic year, to be dispensed over a 12 month period through the host institution. The award will be renewed for a second year of graduate study, upon receipt of a report indicating that the recipient is making normal progress toward the degree and will remain a full-time student in good academic standing at this university. The Acoustical Society of America strongly encourages the host educational institution to waive all tuition costs and assessed fees, in recognition of the stipend award. In addition, the award will cover travel for the student recipient, up to a total of \$1,000, to attend a national meeting of the Acoustical Society of America during the fellowship year.

Topic areas: Study is allowed in all fields of pure and applied science and engineering that are directly related to acoustics. These include:

Evaluation and Selection Process: Applications and supporting materials will be reviewed and evaluated by the Prizes and Special Fellowships Committee of the Acoustical Society, a panel of scientists and engineers with particular interest in education. Criteria for selection will include the academic record of the applicant, the personal statement, and letters of recommendation from three instructors or employers.

Application procedure: The completed application form, official transcripts of all college and university study, Graduate Record Exam scores, and three letters of recommendation should be sent to the address indicated below. Applications must be postmarked not later than 15 April 2008, and all supporting documents must be received not later than 15 April. The successful applicant will be notified by 15 July 2008.
